May this special season prepare you to approach and celebrate God coming near in the gift of Jesus at Christmas.

DAILY QUESTIONS:

Do you recognize this hymn? If so, what memories do you have of this hymn?

If this is a new hymn, what is your first impression?

What does this hymn highlight about who God is and how God moves in the world?

Where do you connect with the hymn and why?

For Advent: How does this hymn prepare you for the coming of Jesus?

Post-Christmas: How does this hymn celebrate Jesus' birth for you?

What is a way you can carry the message of the hymn into your day?

DAILY PRAYER:

Loving God, open my heart to the wonders and love of this season. Use today's hymn and scripture to draw me closer to you. Remove the things that take up the room in my heart and head that belongs to you. Help me to wait for you. Help me prepare the way for your coming, your love, and your will. (Continuing to pray silently). O grace-filled God, may I say, "Yes" like Mary, may I worship like the angels, may I be loyal like Joseph, may I share the good news of you coming near like the shepherds, and may I be on the lookout and meet you on the way like the wisemen.
